Girls

- * Royal Blue Cardigan/ Jumper

- * Blue Shirt

Boys

- * Royal Blue Jumper
- * Grey Trousers (Shorts in Summer Term)
- * Blue Shirts
- * Grey Socks

All Children

- * Royal Blue and Grey Stripped Tie
- * Black Footwear appropriate for school .

Foundation Stage children to wear black footwear with Velcro straps.

Coloured trainers or coloured laces are not school uniform and parents will be contacted to provide all black footwear if your child is wearing non regulation shoes/ trainers.

Nursery

PE Kits

- * Children in years Reception to Year 6 are all required to wear a school PE kit for Physical Education.

Personalised uniform, PE Kits and school ties are all available to purchase from the school office and will be available during the Open Evening.

Jewellery

For health and safety reasons, children are not permitted to wear jewellery in school. Parent are asked to comply with this regulation as accidents have occurred with jewellery in the past.

Medicines

The school follows the policy and guidance on the administering of medicines as set out by the Local Authority. School staff are not permitted to administer medication to children.

If your child is prescribed medicines by the family doctor or the hospital, they may still attend school, but you are required to complete three forms which can be obtained from the school office or can be downloaded from our school website www.oliprimaryschool.co.uk.

The first asks permission of the school to supervise your child whilst taking their medication. The second gives details of the medication, dosage and how frequently it should be taken and must have a photograph of your child attached for identification purposes. The third must be signed by the family GP who has prescribed the medication. This is the policy for administering medication as written by The Local Authority.
