The children will continue to access Phonics, Spelling, English and Maths everyday and will have lessons in RE, PE and foundation subjects throughout the afternoon sessions.

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Phonics

Particularly for our Year One children Phonics is an area for focus throughout the year. This term we will be preparing for the Phonics Screening Assessment and ensuring all children access phonics teaching every day.

Year Two children will continue to revisit phonics and be introduced to spellings throughout the term, we ask that you practise these at home whenever possible.

English

This term we will be focusing on a range of writing genres including, Traditional Tales, Instructions, Non-Chronological Reports and Poetry. There will be an increased emphasis on spelling correctly within writing and using phonetic knowledge independently in order for our children to reach the expected standard. Children will take part in a range of exciting English lessons, taking on different roles and experiencing stories through drama.

Mathematics

We are continuing with number operations for the first half term revisiting concepts of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division across the Key Stage. The children will be exposed to challenging questions throughout maths lessons and encouraged to use problem solving skills in order to develop a mastery of the subject. Counting in multiples of twos fives and tens is paramount for success this half term.

Topic Work

Our topic work this half term includes Design Technology, ICT and PSHE objectives, we are re-creating "The Great British Bake Off". Children have been part of the planning process and have decided to follow a number of interesting lines of enquiry.

Family Fridays and Parent Workshops

We are confident that the children are settled into what is going to be a very busy term and as a result of consulting parents last term we have decided to set dates each half term for one Family Fridays session and a selection of workshops that will allow us to help parents who wish to gain more knowledge in phonics, reading spelling, handwriting and maths.

RSPB

On the 19th January we have a visit from the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds. They will be completing interactive sessions with us and the children on the following topics: Giving Nature A Home, Bioblitz and Bog Schools Bird Watch. The sessions will all be held outdoors so please can you make sure your child has a pair of wellingtons or sturdy shoes and a thick warm coat.

Last year the schools project saw over 91000 children enjoy fun sessions all over the country. The learning was interactive and the feedback from the pupils showed the experience to be a valuable learning session.

On the 7th February the school will be taking part in Internet Safety Day. Your children will be accessing fun interactive opportunities to learn all about internet safety and how they can protect themselves and others.
