Interventions in Key Stage One

Phonics

Every afternoon we are joined by Mrs Bowcock our Reading Recovery Teacher to support us in learning and preparing Phonics for the Phonics Skills Test in June. We are specifically looking at our sounds and decoding and re-blending to sound out real and nonsense words. The Phonics Screening Test is a statutory test for all Year 1 pupils and Year 2 pupils who did not reach the expected pass mark last year. The children have 40 words to decode and re-blend correctly looking at their letters and sounds. The afternoon phonics sessions are fun interactive sessions that consolidate the children's class learning.

1st Class at Number

Mrs O'Leary delivers this programme to Year 2 children, who take part in 3 sessions of practical maths activities each week for 12 weeks. This has a really positive impact on children's skills in number in class.

Outdoor Learning

As the weather gets warmer we try to make the most of our outdoor learning environment by teaching lessons outside, we do this for a number of reasons and have found it to be an effective way of ensuring engagement, embedding learning and creating memories. This term will see the children using the school grounds regularly so it is essential that they are dressed appropriately and are protected from the sun, we recommend that sun cream is applied before the day begins and caps

Phonics Screening

The Week beginning 12th June 2017, all Year 1 and some Year 2 children will complete phonics screening during this week. The children are required to read 40 words which are phonetically decodable and parents will receive information in their child's summer report indicating if they reached age related expectations. If any parents have any questions about the test please don't hesitate to ask.

Year 2 Swimming

Year 2 children have started attending swimming lessons every Thursday. This really helps the children progress with their confidence in the water. These sessions will continue until the end of term.
