Listening to feedback

At the end of the summer term we gathered the views of children and parents because we feel it is important to listen to feedback so that we can keep improving. We also want to ensure that we are supporting our families and meeting the needs of all of the children in school. For your information I have summarised the findings below.

Pupil Voice

All children from years 2-6 completed the questionnaire

There was positive feedback for all questions

- 100% of children feel safe and happy at school
- 100% of children find it easy to make friends at our school
- 100% of children know how to stay safe online
- 100% of children feel that staff support their learning and the vast majority of children feel challenged in their learning
- Most children know what to do if they ever felt bullied or witnessed bullying

After listening to the children these are our areas for development this term

- To ensure that our playground leaders are well trained and are used effectively to support children's playtimes
- To ensure there are plenty of play activities available to the children at lunch and playtimes
- To use circle times to ensure all children know who they can go to if they need help or if they have a problem
- To elect a new school council so that the children's views and opinions are gathered each week.

Parental voice

We gathered 100 replies to our parental questionnaire from Nursery to Year 6.

We also listened to your comments and so:

- We would like to thank parents for the many positive and complimentary comments that you made about school
- We have introduced mathematics homework books across key stage 2 and purchased new home reading records, which have lots of information to support parents with home reading, spellings and grammar. We will also ensure that there is a more consistent approach to homework
- We will ensure that revision materials are available on the school website for the Y2 and Y6 children in the spring term as SATs approach. Parents requested this.
- From January we will continue to offer weekly SAT booster sessions in Y6 to prepare our children and take the pressure off parents. These sessions take place after school.
- We have ensured that the school's process and policy for dealing with any alleged incidents of bullying is available on the school website for parents information www.oliprimary.co.uk/children/anti-bullying

Antibiotics in school

We have listened to parents who felt that their child's attendance had been negatively affected when they were on antibiotics.

In order to support our families we have introduced a locked medication fridge so that we can safely store antibiotics in school. This means that you can send your child to school when they are taking antibiotics. Please ensure that your doctor has signed the relevant forms, which give the school staff permission to supervise your child whilst taking their medicine.
