Interventions in Key Stage One

Phonics

Everyday we are joined by Mrs Bowcock our Reading Recovery Teacher to support us in learning and preparing Phonics for the Phonics Skills Test in June. We are specifically looking at our sounds and decoding and re-blending to sound out real and nonsense words. The Phonics Screening Test is a statutory test for all Year 1 pupils and Year 2 pupils who did not reach the expected pass mark last year. The children have 40 words to decode and re-blend correctly looking at their letters and sounds. Our daily phonics sessions are fun interactive sessions that consolidate the children's class learning.

1st Class at Number

Mrs O'Leary and Miss Hughes deliver this programme to Year 2 children, who take part in 3 sessions of practical maths activities each week for 12 weeks. This has a really positive impact on children's skills in number in class.

Forest School

Mrs Bradley and Mrs Bowcock are both continuing their training to become Level 3 qualified Forest School Leaders. Forest school is an inspirational process, that offers ALL learners regular opportunities to achieve and develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning experiences in a woodland or natural environment with trees. Now the weather is improving sessions will resume on a Monday morning. Letters will be sent home with further information.

Forest School is a specialised learning approach that sits within and compliments the wider context of outdoor and woodland education.

<u>Attendance</u>

As a whole school and a key stage we are really pushing to constantly maintain and improve our punctuality and attendance rates. SATs for Year 2

We are coming to the beginning of our SATs testing period. The staff would like to remind Year 2 parents that this is a very important time in your child's education and the children need to be prepared for their busy days. Early nights, good breakfasts and coming to school on time will help ensure that all children are settled and ready to perform at their best. Results from the SATs will be shared with parents in the Summer reports.





Phonics Screening

During mid June all Year 1 and some Year 2 children will complete phonics screening during this week. The children are required to read 40 words which are phonetically decodable and parents will receive information in their child's summer report indicating if they reached age related expectations. If any parents have any questions about the test please don't hesitate to ask.

Summer Uniform

Thank you for your continued support in following the schools uniform policy, the children look very smart and it is nice to see the summer uniforms too. Please remember to regularly check that your child's uniform is clearly labeled with their name.

Year 2 Swimming

Year 2 children have started attending swimming lessons every Thursday. This really helps the children progress with their confidence in the water. These sessions will continue until the end of term. Could you please ensure that your child continues brings a healthy snack and drink with them, thank you.
