
# Playground questionnaire results 2018

# Key Stage One questions asked:


Questions

### **Key findings**

Both questionnaires received very positive results however we always strive to listen to the children's views and continually improve the children's experiences during play time.

### **Key stage One**

#### **Positive areas**

- 100% of children feel safe on the yard
- 100% of children agree that the adults help to keep them safe on the yard and resolve any issues with friends
- most children feel like they know at least one person they can talk to if they feel upset.

### **Areas of development**

- Not all children felt they had enough equipment to play with- Action- Purchase new equipment
- Not all children benefitted from the playground leaders' work- **Action-** Refresh training and provide some new games to interest the children.

### **Key Stage Two**

#### **Positive areas**

- 100% of children feel safe on the yard
- 100% of children agree that the adults help to keep them safe on the yard and resolve any issues with friends
- Most children agree that there are lots of games to play
- There has been a very positive impact on discouraging inappropriate language with a decrease in the language used.

## **Areas of development**

- Not all children benefitted from the playground leaders' work- **Action** Refresh training and provide some new games to interest the children.
- Not all children felt they had enough equipment to play with- Action- Purchase new equipment
