How can I help my child this term?

Here are a couple of ideas...

 Times tables continue to be an important focus for us in year 5. Children are expected to finish this school year with fluency up to the 12 times tables. You can help your child by practicing at home, here's a link to a good website!

- Please ensure your child is reading at home, ask staff for a book recommendation! Their reading record must come into school each day.
- Weekly spellings are given out ahead of a test each Friday. The words chosen are linked to the work we'll be doing in class, so helping your child to practice would be very beneficial.
- Please ensure that your child's P.E kit is brought into school on Fridays for dance, as well as Mondays if they attend gymnastics after school.

In Mathematics our focus is...

To begin to explore fractions, decimals and percentages. Children will continue to use our new Singapore Maths scheme to understand fractions in more depth, including adding, ordering and simplifying them. This work will link to arithmetic and reasoning activities surrounding decimals and percentages. Could your child recognize fractions, decimals and percentages in our day-to-day lives? Seeing the child make excellent progress in their numeracy skills so far this year has been a pleasure, they have a lot to be proud of!

Our English focus this term is...

To write recounts in a first-person narrative, using our trip to the University of Liverpool as an inspiration. After that, we will be using our geography work on rainforests as a basis upon which to write persuasive pieces. The term will finish with a focus on performance poetry, using the sights and culture of the city of Liverpool as our inspiration.



Dissecting flowers to look at the reproduction of plants! In Geography we are looking at the rainforests of the world.

Children will be looking at the location, physical geography and climate of the world's rainforests. We'll be looking into the ethical and moral issues surrounding rainforests too, as we look at the ongoing issue of deforestation and fair trade. You and your child could prepare for this by looking at some relevant videos beforehand, see

During this term, children will be looking at the diversity of the animal kingdom and where animals live. This continues on from our work on animals including humans in which we looked at life cycles.

We will explore food chains and food webs, as well as some aspects of natural selection.

We will look at reproduction in plants and animals, including metamorphosis!
