



Our partnership began in 2015, when Asha, a volunteer with Ankoma Outreach came to work with two Year 5 classes. They learnt about the way of life in Ankoma, for children of primary school age. There is a huge contrast between our lives and theirs.













We began to write letters to each other and send pictures!







We have also donated football kits!

- It costs just £9 to send a child in Ankoma to school for a year. This means they can learn like we do so they can get jobs and earn money for their families.
- It costs only £4 per child to pay for health insurance so they can get medicine and treatment when they are sick or hurt.

How many children do you think we could help?

This year's focus...

 Each class will set a monetary target to help a certain number of children go to school and get health insurance.

- If we raise £52 per class (about £2-£3 per pupil) this will pay for 4 children to get healthcare and go to school for a year.
- We have 12 classes in school how many children can we help?

So how will we raise the money?

- Lenten giving is about doing small things to help others in big ways.
- We want to "do" things to raise the money... not just ask parents for it.
- Each class can decide what they are going to do to raise money.
