# In Mathematics our focus is... Multiplication and Division

By the end of Year 3, the children are expected to know the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables.

In school, we are having weekly tests and speed tests to secure these facts. Can you please ensure your child is regularly practicing their times tables at home.

**Fractions** You could explore practical fraction problems when cooking or cutting up pizzas or pies, especially looking at tenths multiple parts of tenths (3/10, 7/10)and adding fractions (2/10 + 3/10, 3/6 + 1/6)

**Time** Year 3 looks for the connection between digital and analogue time and working out lengths of time. A really useful activity could be to look at digital time on computers, microwaves, phones and I pads.

# Our English focus this term is...

**Play Scripts** We have used our visit to the Pantomime as a stimulus for play scripts so if you know anyone who is part of a drama club, a look at their scripts will be a great help.

# **Formal and informal Persuasive Writing**

(letters and adverts) Look at magazines and newspapers and see if there are any particular phrases or particular words which are used to try to persuade people to do or buy something.

**Stories with an Imaginary Settings** If you're a fan of 'Star Wars' or any story set in an imaginary place, then discuss the setting and try to use adjectives to describe ityou could make it a 2A or 4A sentence by changing a simple sentence from 'A golden landscape' to 'A smooth, golden landscape' (2A) to 'A smooth, golden landscape with tall, rocky hills' (4A).
