English in Year One

This term we will be focusing on traditional tales. We will be exploring the settings using descriptive language, and comparing good and bad characters in original and alternative versions of some chosen tales.

Maths in Year One

This term we will be concentrating on subtraction within 10 and positional and directional language before looking at numbers within 20.

Homework

Homework will be set every Friday to be returned on Wednesday of the following week please.

How you can help your child this term:

- Children need PE kit in school every Monday to be kept in school all week as sessions take place on different days.
- Reading at home regularly with your children for a couple of minutes. This will really support them in consolidating the skills they are developing in school.
- As our phonics lessons start at 9.10am punctuality is of great importance.

Our Geography Topic is 'Where do the leaves go in winter?'

Please help your child to identify the weather when they come to school or go for a walk. We will be looking at weather patterns within the UK and comparing the weather in different continents. Children will learn about the North Pole, South Pole and the Equator. If it is possible ask your children to do a daily weather report and watch weather bulletins on TV.

The children will really engage with this topic and we plan to SKYPE other schools around the country and talk to them about their weather to see the difference of weather throughout the UK.

Art

We have been focusing on painting this term. The children have studied the work of Jasper Johns and have re-created Zero Through Nine, one of his masterpieces. They are also experimenting with mixing colours and painting in response to stories.

As a school The Digital Leaders will be holding a poster competition with some brilliant prizes to be won. The posters will be used to promote safer internet use around the school. Science - Animals including humans.

Our science work this term is focusing on animals including humans. We are learning about their offspring and how they grow into adults. We will find out about and describe the basic needs of animals for survival (water, food and air). We will describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.
