How can I help my child this term?

Here are a couple of ideas...

- Make sure your child reads with a family member regularly and that they bring their signed reading record and folder to school each day.
- Remember to bring PE kit to school every week, we have PE sessions this term on Tuesday and dance on Thursday.
- Practice our pre cursive letters at home with your child, these will be sent home with your child.
- Help your child with their homework. Make it a routine so that your child is used to doing the homework at a particular time or a particular day. This helps with reading as well.

In Mathematics our focus is Multiplication and Division

We will be practising the 2, 5, 10 times tables. We shall send them home for you to practise with your child. It would be helpful for you to also help them write the calculations down.

How to get a pen license in KS1

Mrs Sergeant is really impressed with the children's handwriting and after looking at the children's work is happy for the children to have a pen license in KS1. Certain criteria has been set by the teachers but it is a privilege to gain your pen license. If your child receives a pen license please celebrate this achievement with them.

The criteria includes:

- writing cursively
- writing on the line, using finger spaces
- Correctly formed letters with ascenders and descenders.

Each year the children are re-assessed to work towards a pen license using the criteria of the different year groups.

Reading.

We encourage all our children to read for pleasure every day. This lets the children experience a wide variety of texts including non-fiction, play scripts and fiction. There is strong evidence linking reading for pleasure and educational outcomes. We know that academic attainment is of vital importance, but the benefits of reading for pleasure go beyond this and stretch throughout your child's life. The outcomes of reading will occur more often and more strongly if reading is enjoyable in the first instance. This is why the 'for pleasure' element of reading for pleasure is so important.



Our Geography Topic is Where do the leaves go in winter?

Please help your child to identify the weather when they come to school or go for a walk. We will be looking at weather patterns within the UK and comparing the weather in different continents such as The North Pole and The Equator. If it is possible ask your children to do a daily weather report and watch weather bulletins on TV. The children will really engage with this topic and we plan to SKYPE other schools around the country and talk to them about their weather to see the difference of weather throughout the UK.
