How can I help my child this term?

Here are a couple of ideas...

- We are beginning to see the value in home reading and are pleased to see how many of our pupils' skills of comprehension, and scores in tests, have significantly increased. We ask parents to encourage their children to read each night for 15 minutes as this can really make a difference.
- Can you please ensure your child has the correct PE kit in school each week.
- We know that year six can be a very challenging year and we ask parents to support the children by ensuring they get enough sleep, to help them cope with a very demanding curriculum.
- Websites/Apps:
 - Help your child to learn their times tables and practice basic skills in maths: *Hit the Button*
 - To help with GPS revisions, in preparation for key stage two SAT's: *Killer SAT Grammar*

Booster Classes: This year is extremely important for our current year six classes as they face end of key stage SAT tests. Based on last year's tests it is clear they will be very challenging. Therefore, preparation booster sessions are held every Wednesday for all children in Year 6, from 3.00 - 4.00pm. We would encourage all children to attend as this is a fantastic opportunity for the children to work intensively with a teacher in very small groups. The sessions allow pupils to prepare for their end of Key Stage Two assessment tasks in May, in a supportive environment.

Internet Safety Day February 5th 2019

Safer Internet Day 2019 will be celebrated globally with the theme: Together for a better internet. As a school The Digital Leaders will be holding a poster competition with some brilliant prizes on offer. The posters will help to promote safer internet use around school. The children will take part in engaging lessons and activities designed to encourage us to show respect online.

In Mathematics our focus is...

We will be studying a number of mathematical areas this term. At present we are looking at fractions, decimals and percentages. We will then move onto negative numbers and solving multi-step problems. After half term our focus will fall on BIDMAS, reading and writing co-ordinates + translation; finally for this term, onto area and perimeter of a range of regular and irregular shapes.

Our English focus this term is...

In English we will be working on a number of different genres this term. We will continue to revise many areas of grammar and punctuation. We will also develop our descriptive skills when we write descriptive narrative around a range of settings. We are currently looking at formal letters, giving the children a solid understanding of the key features of a letter; and writing their own independent letter of complaint. You can help your child by showing and discussing formal letters when we might receive them.



Water cycle investigation

In Geography we are looking at

Our current geography topic is *The Water Cycle*. The children will have the opportunity to learn about the different phases of the water cycle, including the scientific process of evaporation, condensation and precipitation. We will also carry out an investigation to allow pupils to physically see the different stages of the cycle. They will also gain a deeper understanding of the key vocabulary associated with the water cycle.

In Science we are looking at

The science topic we are studying at present is *Animals including Humans*. This gives us an opportunity to focus on how lifestyle choices can affect personal health. We will also examine the circulatory system in humans. To support your child's learning it would be helpful if you could discuss different lifestyle choices to ensure a healthy lifestyle.

Homework in year 6

We are very pleased with the children who consistently return Homework each week. We feel it is an important task that reinforces the children's understanding from their learning in class. To remind parents, all Year 6 pupils receive one piece on a Monday, which we ask to be in the following day to review in class and the same on a Tuesday, to be completed and returned on Wednesday.
