What is our curriculum intent?

Last term Mrs. Roberts and Miss Gallagher have been asking the children, parents, staff and governors an important question.

"What do you want children to know and be able to do by the time they leave our school in year 6?"

We would like to thank everyone who took part in our survey. It has helped us to identify what is important to you all so that we can plan our curriculum to meet the needs of the children and school community.

Our Spring Curriculum in Year 1

ENGLISH - This term we are looking at the Traditional tales 'Little Red Riding Hood' and 'The Three Little Pigs'. We are using story maps to retell the story, sequence events and to help us embed story language in our classroom. Maybe you could share some other favourite Traditional tales with the children at home. Can they spot any similarities/differences between them? Which are their favourites and why? Useful websites to support early reading include:

MATHEMATICS - In maths we are consolidating our understanding of numbers to 20 and beginning to look at numbers beyond 20 in a range of practical contexts. The children have really enjoyed playing maths games in class on topmarks.co.uk/maths – these games link to counting, ordering, sequencing and addition and subtraction and will help support and consolidate the skills the children are developing in maths lessons.

SCIENCE - We are looking at different animal groups and sorting and classifying according to features. We are looking at humans as animals and which body parts link to our senses – this will include an investigation using our sense of taste.

RE - This term we will be studying the three themes of Local Church – Community (through the topic Special People), Eucharist – Relating (through the topic Meals) and Lent/Easter - Giving (through the topic change). Suggestions for activities to complete at home can be found on the RE Curriculum Newsletter.

OUR WIDER CURRICULUM FOCUS

In Art we are studying the work of local artist Faith Bebington. She makes animal sculptures our of recycled materials. We are finding out all about her work and will be creating our own sculptures over the coming weeks.

In *History* we are enjoying out topic looking at the Great Fire of London. It has been really exciting to find out what happened in 1666 and how firefighting has changed since 1666 to the modern day. There are some great questions and activities at, which will test the children's knowledge and understanding of the key events. Play an interactive game online at: www.greatfireofLondon.com

Our DT focus is Moving pictures. We will be using levers and linkages to create a moving picture for the story by Oliver Jeffers after half term. At home you could find out about the author and his stories as an introduction to the topic at www.oliverjeffersworld.com

In *Geography* we will be focusing on seasonal change and weather patterns in the UK. During half term you could talk about changes they have observed over recent months. Children could draw and write about what they already know and being it into school following half term.
