

Little Red Riding Hood Ideas

Here are some Little Red Riding Hood ideas to do with the children, we looked at this story over the last few weeks and they loved it! Let your children play and if they want to you could introduce some of these ideas! If you do any of them or any of your own ideas, we would love to see photos on tapestry 😊

Read the story or watch the video – talk about the story together and ask the children questions. E.g: Why did little red riding hood go to granny's? What did the wolf do? What is a woodcutter? Why does he need an axe?

Art – use whatever you have at home to make something to do with the story



Paint pictures of the wolf/little red riding

Colour in pictures of the characters of the story (there's some on twinkl that you can get for free)

Roleplay – act out the story with the children. You could talk about the start, middle and end of the story and take turns being the different characters. The children love doing this in F1 and can remember key words from the text, such as 'why granny what big teeth you have'

You could also use the coloured in pictures to re-tell the story with the children!

You could sequence the story with pictures (free from twinkl)

Maths – count out food items into a basket. Tell the children a number and ask them to count out that many items and you have some items too. Ask the children who has more? Can they add 1 more? Can they share it with granny?

Understanding the World – together find out facts about forest! Can they look at different videos of woods/forests/rainforests/jungles?

You could also ask them if wolves are real and where would they live?

Construction – let the children play with any construction items you have and if they want to let them have a go at making their own house? Can they be 'architects' and draw their house first?

Playdough – the children love playing with playdough! They could have a go at making their own wolf or red riding hood!
