Personal, Social and Emotional Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Enjoy spending time with each other.• Listen to some lovely relaxing music together in your cosy den or space.• Look at family photographs together.
Communication and Language Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Understand and act on simple sentences for example: 'Can you find your coat?' 'Make the Dinosaur jump (or any toy.)'• Talk about past events when looking at your family photographs.• Listen to simple stories and understand what is happening.
Physical Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Encourage your child to continue washing their own hands and using hand sanitiser.• Continue to let your child to put on their own coat, hat and scarf to go outdoors.• Please continue with potty and toilet training to develop self- help skills. Can they pull their own pants down and back up again after going to the toilet?• If you have play dough ask your child to show you the moves from our Daily Dough Gym Sessions: "Roll, Pat, Squeeze, Poke" You could try this to your favourite music. If you haven't got any play dough a piece of screwed up paper would do.
Literacy.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Log into Rising Stars Login and access the books set by your teacher for daily reading.• Read a comic or your favourite book together.• Mark making - drawing freely with crayons or pencils on paper. Can you say what your marks are? Have you got a big piece of paper and try mark making on a larger scale?

Maths.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Complete a jigsaw.• Join in with a counting song to develop your counting skills 'Ten Little Dinosaurs'• Fill and empty containers. You could do this when you were in the bath or have a small bowl of water with a plastic jug and empty yogurt pots.• Look in your house or outside to see if you can find a triangle.
Topic.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• I have made suggestions of activities you could try at home. You can change these to suit your child's interest, in school we are doing the same activities as you.• We are going to be creating a 'Dinosaur area' so if your child has any Dinosaurs they could play with them in their cosy space or den area.• Read your own favourite story or listen to 'Dinosaur Roar.'
