Personal, Social and Emotional Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Go on a woodland walk looking for habitats of the characters from the story. Can you help your grown up by helping zipping up your coat and putting on your gloves and hat.
Communication and Language Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Watch the movie The Gruffalo BBC The Gruffalo Video Act out the story and perform it to the rest of your family, using the repeated phrases 'There's no such thing as a Gruffalo'.• Follow this link for a phase 1 phonics Listening activity based on the Gruffalo Phase 1 listening game could you hear all the animal sounds in the deep dark woods? Try to make those sounds whilst moving your body to be a snake, owl and fox, mouse and Gruffalo!
Physical Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Try to make the animal sounds whilst moving your body to be a snake, owl and fox, mouse and Gruffalo!• Join in with 'Woodland Cosmic Yoga'. Woodland Cosmic yoga
Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Log into My Rising Stars and access the books set by your teacher for daily reading. Password: OLI123 and Centre Number: 6008942• Together share the story 'The Gruffalo' Audio Story of The Gruffalo talk together about the characters the mouse meets on his journey through the woods. Which character do you like best and why?

Maths.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Collect leaves and twigs on your woodland walk and sort by colour size. Count how many objects you have found and practise writing the numeral.• Follow the link to Number Blocks and each day focus on a new number. Can you find that number around your house and in the environment? Can you count out that many objects around the house?
