# Suggested reading/writing activities for children in Y5 based around the book 'The Lost Civilisations of Latin America' Rising Stars Supernova Red+

This book takes children back in time to explore the lost civilisations of Latin America. It is written from a persuasive perspective and enables children to learn about different people and cultures in what we now know as Mexico and Central and South America. It explores the Maya, who built imposing temples and pyramids, and the Inca, who crafted beautiful solid-gold objects and founded the incredible city of Machu Picchu high in the Andes mountains. This book guide delves into the sports they played, the food they ate and the buildings and artwork they created.



### **Before Reading:**

Introduce children to the idea of an ancient civilisation and how non-fiction or information texts will help them to explore this in more detail.

- Ask: Look at the front cover. What does it mean to be lost? Discuss children's responses. Have you heard of the term 'civilisation'? Explain to children that it refers to the society, culture and way of life of an area. This book will help them to explore the term further as it includes detailed descriptions of different civilisations in Latin America.
- Ask: What kinds of features would you expect to find in a non-fiction book? Elicit aspects that are key features, e.g. a contents page, a glossary, index, headings, sub-headings, captions, labels, diagrams, etc.
- Read the back-cover blurb together to find out more about the book before you start reading. What does 'ancestors' mean? Explain to children that these are typically distant relatives from the past.

### Following on from the reading this book, here are your writing activities for the week:

- Monday read pages 2-15 and complete the vocabulary sheet below.
- Tuesday read pages 16-29 and complete the comprehension task below.
- Wednesday read pages 30-35 and complete the Maya mask activity in the Creative Fun and Enrichment section of our timetable. Watch the Youtube video and follow the steps.
- Thursday read pages 46-61 and create a postcard about your visit to a lost civilisation of Latin America. Decorate the front with your own drawings of life in the past and descriptions of your journey on the back.
- Friday read over the Glossary and the meanings of key words within the book and complete the quiz at the end.
