Personal, Social and Emotional Development.	<ul> <li>Enjoy spending time with each other.</li> <li>Listen to some lovely <u>relaxing music</u> together in your cosy den or space.</li> <li>Take a turn when playing 'sorting your socks' activity or when pegging the underpants on a line.</li> </ul>
Communication and Language Development.	<ul> <li>When turn taking talk about "My turn then (child's name) turn."</li> <li>Can you name any dinosaurs?</li> <li>Can you recognise and name any colours when you are sorting and matching you socks.</li> </ul>
Physical Development.	<ul> <li>Encourage your child to continue washing their own hands and using hand sanitiser.</li> <li>Continue to let your child to put on their own coat, hat and scarf to go outdoors.</li> <li>Please continue with potty and toilet training to develop self- help skills. Can they pull their own pants down and back up again after going to the toilet?</li> <li>Try pegging your socks together using a real clothes peg. Can you squeeze it open and then clip it to your socks?</li> </ul>
Literacy.	<ul> <li>Log into <u>Rising Stars Login</u> and access the books set by your teacher for daily reading.</li> <li>Read a comic or your favourite book together.</li> <li>Mark making - drawing freely with crayons or pencils on paper. Can you say what your marks are? Have you got a big piece of paper and try mark making on a larger scale?</li> <li>Repeat some words from the story you have read or from our counting song.</li> </ul>

Maths.	<ul> <li>Can you recognise any numbers that may be on your front door or on the face of a clock?</li> <li>Have fun with developing your maths skills by joining in with some <u>'counting songs.'</u></li> <li>Looking at different patterns? What patterns are the underpants or socks?</li> <li>Develop your sorting and matching skills by sorting household items for example: clothes pegs.</li> <li>Revisit Big and Little. See if you can sort big and little socks.</li> </ul>
Topic.	<ul> <li>I have made suggestions of activities you could try at home. You can change these to suit your child's interest, in school we are doing the same activities as you.</li> <li>Try drawing your favourite pattern. It may be spots, stripes or stars!</li> <li>You could try pegging your own pants onto a line!</li> <li>Read your own favourite story or listen to <u>'Dinosaurs love underpants'</u></li> <li>Listen to the story <u>'The Little Puddle'</u> together.</li> </ul>
