Personal, Social and Emotional Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Enjoy spending time with each other.• Listen to some lovely relaxing music together in your cosy den or space.• Take a turn when playing 'sorting your socks' activity or when pegging the underpants on a line.
Communication and Language Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• When turn taking talk about "My turn then (child's name) turn."• Can you name any dinosaurs?• Can you recognise and name any colours when you are sorting and matching you socks.
Physical Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Encourage your child to continue washing their own hands and using hand sanitiser.• Continue to let your child to put on their own coat, hat and scarf to go outdoors.• Please continue with potty and toilet training to develop self- help skills. Can they pull their own pants down and back up again after going to the toilet?• Try pegging your socks together using a real clothes peg. Can you squeeze it open and then clip it to your socks?
Literacy.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Log into Rising Stars Login and access the books set by your teacher for daily reading.• Read a comic or your favourite book together.• Mark making – drawing freely with crayons or pencils on paper. Can you say what your marks are? Have you got a big piece of paper and try mark making on a larger scale?• Repeat some words from the story you have read or from our counting song.

Maths.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you recognise any numbers that may be on your front door or on the face of a clock? • Have fun with developing your maths skills by joining in with some 'counting songs.' • Looking at different patterns? What patterns are the underpants or socks? • Develop your sorting and matching skills by sorting household items for example: clothes pegs. • Revisit Big and Little. See if you can sort big and little socks.
Topic.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I have made suggestions of activities you could try at home. You can change these to suit your child's interest, in school we are doing the same activities as you. • Try drawing your favourite pattern. It may be spots, stripes or stars! • You could try pegging your own pants onto a line! • Read your own favourite story or listen to 'Dinosaurs love underpants' • Listen to the story 'The Little Puddle' together.
