

Born at a very difficult period in South Africa's history, Chris made a decision early in his life to become an activist and to oppose the racially based system of 'apartheid'. After Nelson Mandela's release in 1990 and the fall of 'apartheid', <b>Chris worked with Nelson Mandela</b> until his retirement as a bodyguard and also got involved in the delicate negotiations with the 'apartheid regime' resulting in subsequent agreement and the drafting of the new constitution.</i></p> <p><i>Apart from sharing his own personal story, Chris shares from the many important lessons and anecdotes that he learned from working with Nelson Mandela and Desmond Tutu.</i></p> <p><b>Teachers will email parents the link to this webinar nearer to the time.</b></p>
