Reading / mark making/Communication and Language Development/ PSED	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Log into Rising Stars Login and access the books set by your teacher for daily reading. Login details: child's full name with a space between first and surname. Password: OLI123 and Centre Number: 6008942• Share the story How to Catch a Star by Oliver Jeffers.• Practise singing our new song from the first week's learning How Can I Catch a Star? inspired by our story focus. Can you hear the triangle? Can you clap along to the beat each time you hear it?• Use your passport to travel into space writing your name and which planet you would like to travel to. Can you remember the names of any planets? Watch a video all about the planets within our solar system and plan a trip!
Phase 1 phonics	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Practice our phase one phonics through voice and environmental sounds following these links Madison and Felix, Environmental sounds• Play phase one phonics games on phonics play. If your child is beginning to hear sounds at the beginning of words try some phase 2 games or play I spy something beginning with..... starting with your child's name.
Physical Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Wrap up warm remembering to put on your own hat, scarf, gloves and coat to develop your self help skills! Go outside for a walk during the early evening when you can see the stars in the sky. Talk about how you could catch a star like the little boy in our story focus. Draw and write a list of all the different ways, practising holding your pencil with good control to draw lines and circles.• Join in with Cosmic Kids Space Yoga to stay fit and healthy!• Use dough to join in with dough disco. This will help you to build up strength in your fingers ready for writing.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practise holding a pencil with good control near the tip to draw and collage the different planets and to write your name.
Maths.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to learn to count forwards and backwards 0-10 with a rocket counting song • Join in with a counting song and blast off to space. • Visit the moon and learn to count with numberblocks. Can you count backwards from 10-0 in your rocket to blast off to the moon? • Practice your counting skills and number recognition by playing these interactive number games
Topic.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to learn about the planets through this fun song! • Sing Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star and watch this short video clip to find out what a star is! • Look at the famous painting Starry Night by Vincent Van Gough and talk about the colours the artist used to create the painting. Draw, collage or paint your own version of starry night.
RE - Come and See	<p>Our topic in Religious Education is - Gathering</p> <p><u>Reveal week 1</u></p> <p>Talk about what is happening in the picture and how the parish family gather for mass.</p> <p>What do you see in the picture?</p> <p>Who are the people?</p> <p>What are the people standing in the door doing?</p> <p>Talk about how people are welcomed as they gather in Church and how they listen to the word of God.</p> <p>Talk about welcoming, gathering and listening. These words are used by the priest to welcome people at the beginning of Mass: "The Lord be with you." And the people say, "And with your spirit." Draw a picture of your Church and ask an adult to help you write in speech bubbles the words the priest says and the response the parishioners give as above.</p>
