**Exclamations** are sentences that we say or read loudly or with lots of feeling. They can show anger, frustration, shock, pain, surprise or excitement. Exclamations should end with an exclamation mark.

- That hurts!
- I scored three goals today!

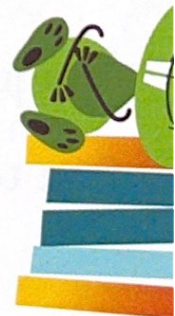
