



## Year 3 and 4 suggested Timetable for World Book Day

2.30-3.00	OLI Book Hunt Challenge




#### English:

- Write your own menu.
- Write instructions for your own recipe.
- Can you create your own Ratburger instructions?
- You have discovered what actually goes into the burgers! Write a letter of complaint to the council.
- Create a biography of David Walliams.
- Create an advert to sell all the different flavours of icecream.

#### Science:

- Make a poster to teach Raj what happened to his pet tadpole Pippadoggy.
- Growing and changing is an important subject in Zoe's school, why not plant some of your own seeds to grow this Spring.
- Make a set of instructions to teach people how to look after a pet hamster, rat or another animal.



#### Maths:

- Create your own Ratburger Brew. Remember to use the correct units of measure!
- In Chapter 10, there is a chart showing the height of different people / creatures. Can you carry out a survey to find the height of children in your class and use these to create charts and graphs?

#### Geography:

- Create your own Tower block of flats in a country you wish. Where will your flats be? What features of the building will you have due to the climate in the setting? What will the uniform be like? Think carefully about the human and physical geography!
- Make your own map of where Zoe lives. Remember to include the flats, Raj's shop, the school and Burt's secret lair where the Purplepiggy is hidden – you could add secret passage ways and cut throughs, or somewhere of your choice and use co-ordinates to plot items.

#### DT:

- Design and create a task for the animals in Zoe's show tournament.
- Design and create your own 'Big Top' circus tent!
- Use a kitchen roll tube to design and make a character from the book.

#### PE:

- Design your own game, like Quidditch, and play it!

#### PSHE:

- Create your own image as an animal– draw an animal or object which represents you and think about the qualities that reflect you. For example, you might choose a Lion because you are brave and a leader. You might draw a dolphin as they are clever, or you might choose to draw something to symbolise kindness, friendship and strength!
- Make a list of things that Zoe could do to find some new friends at her school.
- Zoe is bullied by Tina throughout the story. What could Zoe do to stop this?
- Burt cannot see. Can you find out how being blind affects the lives of those affected?

There is a secret message for children to decode - a help card is included to support.






