Personal, Social and Emotional Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Enjoy spending time with each other.• Listen to some lovely together in your cosy den or space.• Settling back in after half term.
Communication and Language Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Can you listen to the sounds the different 'vehicles make?' Did you recognise any?• Develop pretend play "Can you put your baby to sleep or drive the car to the shops?"• Listen to simple stories and understand what is happening.
Physical Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Encourage your child to continue washing their own hands and using hand sanitiser.• Continue to let your child to put on their own coat, hat and scarf to go outdoors.• Please continue with potty and toilet training.• Outside if you go for a walk can you see any Cars, Buses or Vans?
Literacy.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Log into Rising Stars Login and access the books set by your teacher for daily reading.• Mark making - drawing freely with crayons or pencils on paper. Can you say what your marks are? Have you got a big piece of paper and try mark making on a larger scale?• Can you draw a picture of a vehicle you saw on your walk?• Can you listen to the Nursery Rhyme 'Miss Polly had a Dolly?'• Can you repeat any of the words from it?

Maths.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Chalk a number line outside or draw some numbers with an adult on paper (you may need to use tape to stick them down to the floor indoors). See how many you can recognise. Can you count up and back down again when walking along it.• Do you recognise any numbers on the cars?• How many cars have you found?• Can you sort and match your vehicles?
Topic.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• I have made suggestions of activities you could try at home. You can change these to suit your child's interest, in school we are doing the same activities as you.• <i>Garage and vehicles area:</i> choosing your favourite vehicles to play with.• Looking after the dolls• Read your own favourite story or listen to <u>'Cool Cars.'</u>
