In **history**, children have had building upon their knowledge of Liverpool during the Victorian time period by learning about Dr Duncan and why he is important to our city.

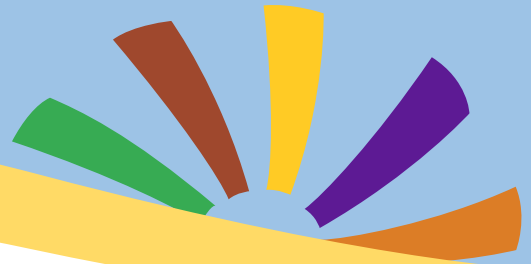
